



The Alberta Team Handball Federation has established the Alberta Team Handball Federation Hall of Fame in dedication of Julius Fodor to honour men and women who have made notable contributions as athletes, coaches, referees or builders to the Team Handball movement in Alberta. We invite any individuals to submit nomination of candidates to receive such recognition for 2010, nominations must be submitted to the ATHF office no later than March 5th, 2010. Members to be inducted in the Alberta Team Handball Federation's Hall of Fame will be elected at the 2010 Alberta Team Handball League Year End Banquet March 20th in Edmonton, Alberta

The following guidelines will govern the selection of individuals to the Alberta Team Handball Federation Hall of Fame:

Eligibility

Membership in the Hall of Fame is open to athletes, coaches, officials, administrators, and volunteers builders who have served the cause of team handball with distinction. Nominees must have participated in team handball, or contributed to the growth and development of team handball, at the provincial level during their career. Athlete nominees must have achieved a significant honour at the provincial level or international level and have been successful over a five-year period, and have retired from competition for a **minimum** of three years.

Coaches, officials, administrators, and volunteers nominees may be either active or inactive at the time of their nomination. Coaches, officials, administrators, and volunteers nominated as builders must have been provincially or internationally successful over a Three year period.

Nomination

Anyone may annually submit two nominations in each category. Deceased athletes, coaches, officials, administrators, and volunteers builders are eligible for consideration. Nominees will be considered for induction in the year nominated, and, if requested by the nominator, for up to two successive years thereafter.

In the event that a nominee is not selected for induction within the three-year period, the nomination will be inactive and may only be resubmitted after a period of three years has elapsed. A maximum of five pages of supporting documentation may accompany each nomination.

Selection

Julius Fodor will appoint a committee appointed and they will evaluate nominees on the basis of the significance and scope of their achievements, their dedication to team handball, the consistency of their performance, and personal qualities such as leadership, sportsmanship, and community service.

Awards

Elected candidates shall receive a ATHF plaque. Their pictures and career history/contribution to team handball history shall be enclosed in the ATHF Web page - Hall of Fame
